
American Association for Cancer Research

The mission of the American Association for Cancer Research is to prevent and cure cancer through research, education, communication and collaboration. The AACR publishes scientific journals, provides an extensive schedule of outstanding cancer research symposia, workshops and conferences, and offers essential training opportunities for the next generation of investigators. With an active government affairs agenda, the AACR increases awareness among legislators and the public about the importance of supporting cancer research. The AACR Foundation and its donors play a pivotal role in facilitating scientific advancement and accelerating progress against cancer.



AACR Basic Facts and Figures at a Glance 2013

- The AACR has distributed more than \$170 million in research funding since 2001.
- Approximately 90 cents of every dollar expended supports research.
- The AACR Foundation provided \$6.4 million in research grants and awards in 2012 to fund and recognize innovative, meritorious research.
- Since 1961, the AACR nas presented 321 prizes, awards and lectureships recognizing the achievements of researchers and physicians who have made significant contributions to the understanding, diagnosis, prevention and treatment of cancer.
- In 2012, collaborating with the Prostate Cancer Foundation and the Cancer Research Institute, Stand Up To Cancer (SU2C) awarded a total of \$30 million to three new SU2C Dream Teams, and \$3.2 million of supplemental funding to existing Dream Teams, bringing the total Dream Team awards to \$112.8 million for nine Dream Teams.
- In 2012, in collaboration with the Dutch Cancer Society, SU2C awarded €1.2 million for a Sta Op Tegen Kanker International Translational Cancer Research Team, creating a new, collaborative, international, translational cancer research team.
- More than 17,000 attendees registered for the AACR Annual Meeting 2012. More than 6,000 scientific abstracts were selected for presentation, complementing an outstanding program of scientific and educational events.
- The AACR convened 18 scientific meetings, conferences and workshops in 2012.
- The AACR publishes eight peer-reviewed scientific journals: Cancer Research; Clinical Cancer Research; Cancer Epidemiology, Biomarkers & Prevention; Molecular Cancer Therapeutics; Molecular Cancer Research; Cancer Prevention Research; Cancer Immunology Research, and Cancer Discovery.
- Articles in AACR journals were accessed more than 42 million times in 2012.
- · Cancer Research, the AACR's oldest journal, is cited more than 100,000 times per year.
- The AACR has more than 34.000 members in 96 countries and territories around the world; over 30 percent of members live outside the United States.
- Now in its ninth year, the AACR's Survivor and Patient Advocacy Program has collaborated with more than 120 advocacy organizations, exposed more than 400 graduates of the Scientist↔Survivor Program to the latest findings in cancer research and publishes Cancer Today, reaching 380,000 cancer patients, survivors, and the friends and family who care for them.
- Founded in 1907, the AACR celebrated 100 years of service to members in 2007 and holds its 104th Annual Meeting this year.
